My primary goal was to fill my future home with paintings once I finally secured my own space. This idea lingered in my mind as I counted the days until I could start this new chapter, and to start painting again.







I never really do study paintings. Mostly my head is enough to imagine and define the shapes and geometry of a new work, using digital formats only to understand the colorways of a given painting. This makes it a very rare piece, that stands out in this series and in my entire oeuvre.




